Teaching consists of lectures, seminars, and exercises. Forms of assessment are exams, tests, and term papers. Program also includes preparation and defense of the diploma thesis.

In BSU student's workload also is evaluated in Credits ECTS. Student's workload involves lectures, practices and self-study. It includes all work needed to prepare for an examination and to meet the requirements. The basic allocation of academic credits in ECTS is 60 credits per year of study. Credits are awarded only when the course has been completed and all required examinations have been successfully passed. b) 1 week of full-time study = 54 AH = 1,5 Credit ECTS.

8. INFORMATION ON THE STATE HIGHER EDUCATION SYSTEM:


The system of education in the Russian Federation comprises:

successive educational programs and the State educational standard;

educational institutions in which educational programs and the State educational standard are implemented; administrative and other bodies and organizations which govern the educational system.

In the Russian Federation, all educational programs are of two types (cf., Diagram 1): general education;

professional education.

General education is aimed at the intellectual, moral, emotional, and physical development of the individual; at shaping his or her general cultural level; at developing his or her ability to adapt himself or herself to life in society, and at the setting of the foundations which will enable individuals to make a conscious choice of a professional education program and to cope with it.

General education comprises:

pre-school education;

primary general education;

basic general education;

secondary (complete) general education.

Professional education is aimed at the continued development of an individual in the process of which he or she acquires a professional qualification and at the preparation of graduates to exercise a profession. Since in the Russian Federation all programs, except general education programs, lead to diplomas or to diplomas and degrees as well as to professional qualifications and give the right to exercise professions, they are called professional education programs. Thus professional education covers the following:

- elementary education (nachalnoe professionalnoe obrazovanie);
- non-university level higher education (srednee professionalnoe obrazovanie);
- university level higher education (vysshee professionalnoe obrazovanie);
- postgraduate education including doctoral study programs (poslevuzovskoe professionalnoe obrazovanie).
